Austin Outside is pleased to support the City of Austin's application for a 2024 Bridge Investment Program discretionary grant to fund replacement of the Barton Springs Road Bridge. Austin Outside is a coalition of nonprofit organizations who strive to build equitable access to outdoor parks, greenspaces, and natural areas that are connected by a safe and comfortable network of trails, bikeways, and sidewalks. Austin Outside supports this application to fully replace this bridge that is a vital link to Austin's signature park, Zilker Park, and believes the enhanced bicycle and pedestrian facilities will significantly improve safety and access to this area of Austin that is known for its robust network of parks and trails.

The City has invested significant resources over a decade to assess the condition of the bridge and identify the best solution for extending its life, ensuring safety, and meeting the needs of community-users. The bridge design complements ongoing City efforts to make bicycle and pedestrian travel along Barton Springs Road safer and more accessible to residents coming from the east, including those who access Zilker Park through major intersecting corridors and via transit.

The Barton Springs Road Bridge Project will ensure the bridge can continue to support current and future demands from residents of our growing city and region. It will offer safe multi-modal paths, which will include interior barriers for pedestrians and exterior barriers for bicyclists. The multi-modal paths will align with existing Zilker Park shared use paths, trails, and amenities, thereby ensuring public access to this iconic park for generations to come.
